We are in a period of extraordinary expansion and complexity in gender theorizing. Yet, even in a widened world of theory and acceptance, gender nonbinary, transgender and gender stand at the intersection of race and class and create a fascinating but challenging terrain for all of us to navigate. In this presentation, Dr. Harris will examine the contradictions in many contemporary experiences of gender, sexuality and subjectivity. The possible permutations and organizations of gendered subjects is rich and complex, at the same time that conviction and conventions of heteronormativity exert a powerful effect.

For many years, Dr. Harris has been looking at psychoanalytic theory, models of chaos theory and nonlinear dynamics, and their implications for race, class, and gender dynamics. She addresses our constant experiences of interpellation, invasion and colonization of many forces cultural and interpersonal, and she confronts our suffering and resistance. This presentation will focus on theory as it applies to and expands our sense of clinical complexity and the challenges of working with all gendered experiences.

At the conclusion of the conference, attendees will be able to:

1. Discuss, compare, and use different models of gender development.
2. Analyze and critique the concept of intersectionality -- the examination of interactions across gender, class, race and sexuality -- as it may be applied in clinical work.
3. Demonstrate the clinical application of contemporary gender theory across different personality organizations and identifications: Cis, Trans, Gender, Queer, Non Binary.
4. Discuss the contemporary research on gender differences and in particular the stress on boys' development.
5. Explain the causes of, and distinctions between envy generated in men and in women.

**Adrienne Harris, PhD** is Faculty and Supervisor at New York University Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis. She is on the faculty and is a supervisor at the Psychoanalytic Institute of Northern California. She is an Editor at *Psychoanalytic Dialogues*, and *Studies In Gender and Sexuality*. In 2009, she, Lewis Aron, and Jeremy Safron established the Sandor Ferenczi Center at the New School University. She, Lew Aron, Eyal Rozmarin and Steven Kuchuck co-edit the Book Series *Relational Perspectives in Psychoanalysis*. She is an editor of the IPA ejournal, *Psychoanalysis.Today*.



**Daniel Cohen, LCSW-C** is a psychotherapist in private practice in Baltimore, Maryland and a student in the Contemporary Approaches to Psychodynamic Psychotherapy (CAPP) program at ICP+P. He is committed to providing LGBTQ-affirming care in his clinical work. Previously, he practiced at the Johns Hopkins Community Psychiatry Program in their Mental Illness and Substance Abuse Program and Anxiety Disorders Program. He is passionate about using psychoanalytic-informed approaches in his practice and in understanding the theory that accompanies those approaches.
